





Revenue per business area / 2016





Environment	 The Circular Economy Package plans to require member states to recycle at least 50% of municipal waste by 2020 and 65% by 2030 (70% for packaging waste) Potential for international organic growth (America, Central Europe)




Czech Republic - SmVak

Project: Integrated Water Management, is the main operator of the regions of Moravia and Silesia. SmVak owns the infrastructure (and is therefore an activity of indefinite duration). It is one of the few existing cases of transboundary water supply, providing service through its infrastructure to 100,000 people in nearby Poland.

SmVaK subsidiary aqualia has 1,300,000 users and has a supply network that measures 6,000 kilometers.
